Spencer Elliott is a certified athletic trainer (ATC) and Clinic Administrator at CoreLife - Novant Health in Charlotte, North Carolina. His attention to detail combined with big-picture thinking has improved efficiency, quality, and delivery to improving patient care outcomes across multiple platforms in athletics from elite to scholastic sports to healthcare organizations.

His professional career began as an Athletic Trainer with the Baltimore Orioles where he has since gone on to serve many top sports organizations across elite athletics such as USA Swimming's Men's & Women's Olympic Teams for the Rio & London games, four USOC Olympic Trials (Whitewater Canoe & Kayak) & one Canadian Olympic Trial (Whitewater Canoe & Kayak), three USOC Paralympic Trials (Swimming, Cycling, Track & Field), top organizations within NASCAR's Cup Series such as Chip Ganassi Racing, Michael Waltrip Racing, and Furniture Row Racing; and assisting Major League Baseball's concussion program for Minor League Umpires. He has also lead and/or consulted for some the the top sports medicine healthcare organizations in the country such as Atrium Health, Novant Health, Duke Medical Center, MedStar, the University of Kansas Medical Center, Baton Rouge Orthopaedic Clinic, and Conway Medical Center.

Spencer has presented on a variety of topics numerous times across the United States at various organizational meetings such as the American Medical Society for Sports Medicine, NASCAR's Medical Summit, and the North Carolina Athletic Trainers' Association; he's co-authored leading research in cardiology screenings of pediatric athletes published in Heart Rhythm, the only publication in the world serving the electrophysiology community; has written and assisted on research grants totaling \$2.2M; and has been recognized with NASCAR's Above & Beyond for Medical Care Award and nominations towards East Carolina University's 40 Under Forty Leadership and Charlotte Business Journal's Top 40 Under 40 awards.

His work to assist the sports medicine community around concussion continues as he serves as 1 of 8 representatives to the NFL's AT Spotter Advisory Committee, 1 of 32 Lead Lead AT Spotter's for the NFL's Concussion Spotter program; a Medical Observer to the Southeastern Conference and to the Charlotte Sports Foundation Bowl Committee, and as a Ad Hoc consultant to NASCAR's Medical Liaison Department.

Spencer holds a Master's Degree in Exercise & Sports Science (Sports Management) from East Carolina University & Bachelor's degrees in both Athletic Training and Sports Science from Chowan University.
